MESSAGE FROM OUR FAMILIES

Times have changed. Our impression of homelessness has usually allowed for an easy picture. Most people typically envision, an older white male in unkempt clothing, reeking of alcohol, and begging for spare change. This is not the case for many families in Juneau. FPJ is seeing more needs within the working-class family unit. This poses its own unique issues but usually comes with a higher level of functioning. Employment requires timeliness, effort, and dedication—traits the family we want to share with you have in abundance.

The Demmert family of six came to Family Promise of Juneau in late November of 2022. They had previously lived in Juneau and decided to relocate out of the state, but the pandemic hit and life wasn't going the way they had hoped, so they packed up their large family and returned to Juneau. They had been attempting to find housing and balance staying in a hotel for a few months before they reached out for support. FPJ placed them on our food rotation and provided for their basic needs while they stayed in the hotel. Our amazing volunteers wrapped them in love and blessed them with Christmas gifts. The family participated in our stocking event (remotely due to illness) and mentioned that without FPJ their children would not have had a Christmas at all.

Quickly they were offered a temporary place with our partner agency St. Vincent de Paul. At first, staff questioned if they would accept moving into an even smaller space with fewer accommodations, but not only did they accept the offer but they were ecstatic about something more secure and affordable. FPJ assisted with cots for the children and bedding. As they settled into their new place, mom worked tirelessly to find permanent housing. As a Native Alaskan family, they had access to resources through Tlingit and Haida. Mom successfully got the family placed on a waitlist for housing through T&H.

Then no sooner than they settle into their space at SVDP, they discover they are ill (again) and this time it turned out to be COVID. They were placed back in a hotel! It seemed like the family couldn't catch a break. They returned back to SVDP after quarantine and were ready to do life the best they could when they got their break! T&H had a lead on housing, moving as quickly as they could, they got all the paperwork needed and were approved for their own housing. Mom couldn't contain her joy! She had done all the hard work but recognized the role that FPJ played and was so grateful for that. February marked 7 months that the family had been struggling with finding housing and food security. As of today, they are in a home, with full cabinets and full hearts! THANK YOU FAMILY PROMISE!

We have been receiving support from Family Promise for a few months. I have heard from people that have been here before. They talk about all of the love, support and friendships that were created. The staff work to provide support I have never experienced before, their volunteers are always kind and loving when bringing meals. We are grateful for the amazing support we received.
