In 2010, our food pantry at Shepherd of the Valley experienced increased traffic in the summer with families trying to feed extra mouths out of school so we started our summer lunch program. We celebrated this year our fifth year of serving lunches, but in the midst of this time with youth, our eyes were opened to how many families face homelessness with few resources for support. That's what started my passion for Family Promise. It not only supports families who are facing homelessness, but gathers people around tables for meals and fellowship. That changes everyone's lives and hearts.

If anyone had said at the beginning of summer lunch that we would need 72 different volunteers to see us through a summer, we would have balked. We only have an average worship size of 75. This past year 72 volunteers donated at least 2000 hours. When we engage in something meaningful, then folks get excited and want to have a part.

Good things are happening to move Family Promise of Juneau forward and we are asking everyone to think about the part they can play.

It is daunting, but doable. If everyone offers what they can, we can make this happen.

Family Promise is a community response to families experiencing homelessness by providing hospitality in area churches. Guests receive hospitality and three meals a day from church members and volunteers. Family Promise case managers work with guest parents to ensure they can regain their self-sufficiency.

The interfaith hospitality network program began in Union County, New Jersey, in 1986, in response to the growing number of homeless families seeking shelter and support services. Successful non-profit programs for families experiencing homelessness have been implemented by a number of communities based on this model for the past thirty years throughout the nation including Wasilla.
